While the Anaheim Union High School District is centered in the city of Anaheim, it stretches across 46 square miles and draws students from 55 feeder elementary schools in the cities of Anaheim, Cypress, La Palma, Buena Park, and Stanton. The combined population of these five communities totals approximately half a million people.

Tourism and entertainment are the dominant industries in the greater Anaheim area, featuring Disneyland, Knott's Berry Farm, the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim baseball team, the Anaheim Ducks hockey team, and the largest meeting facility on the West Coast, the Anaheim Convention Center. 
